





Main (old) lessons being reacted to:

- Shelter staff need to feel comfortable and confident with HLP issues – and with their legal/protection colleagues
- Rights and principles need to be locally contextualised – by local actors
- HLP intervention is a "good enough" science

## Overview of tenure

#### Forms of housing tenure

#### Ownership

 Full control over housing and land with the right to use, control, and transfer, subject to law and local regulations.

#### Use rights

- The right of people to use either public or private property for their housing needs under certain conditions.
- **Rental** (by definition a form of use rights)
  - Right to use housing or land for a specified period of time at a given price, without transfer of ownership, on the basis of a <u>written</u> or <u>verbal</u> contract with a private or public owner.

#### Collective tenure


 Ownership, rental or use rights over land and housing are shared under joint governance structures.

  - maybe more a matter of more secure/less secure













