Project aim



In essence...

 Ensure there is sufficient capacity within the EU and neighbouring states to provide shelter for those affected by major disaster (due to natural hazards)

Major?

- National capacity overwhelmed
- 100,000 displaced with 10,000 needing shelter in collective centres / camps for extended period
- EU Civil Protection mechanism activated
