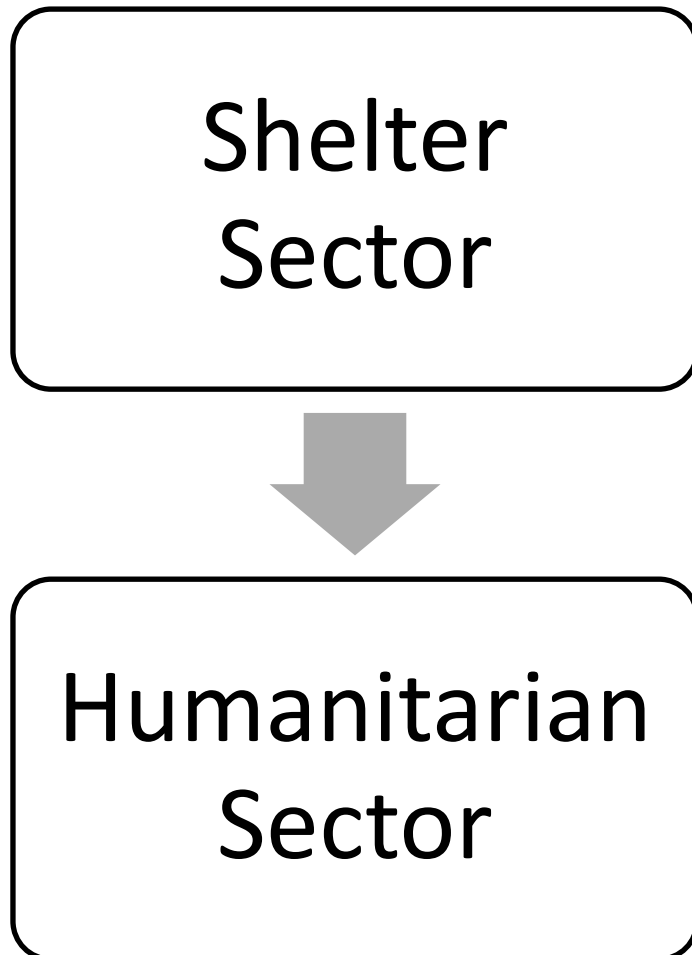
The Integrated Approach

A series of three complementary resources, supporting the global humanitarian community of practice:

- The Humanitarian Library
- The Humanitarian Training
- The Humanitarian Meeting

Integrated Approach



- It has been noted that the same issues affecting the Shelter Sector have been affecting the whole humanitarian sector
- Decision to expand projects to an integrated approach including all humanitarian sectors

(Regional Advisory Groups) RAGs

- All three resources proposed will be developed in an iterative and service-oriented manner.
- Will include donors, governments, CBOs, NNGOs, INGOs, the Red Cross Movement, IOs, UN bodies, independents and academics.
- RAGs will constitute regional technical bodies.
- RAGs have been piloted successfully in projects funded by ECHO (CORE) and USAID OFDA ('Shelter and Settlement Library').

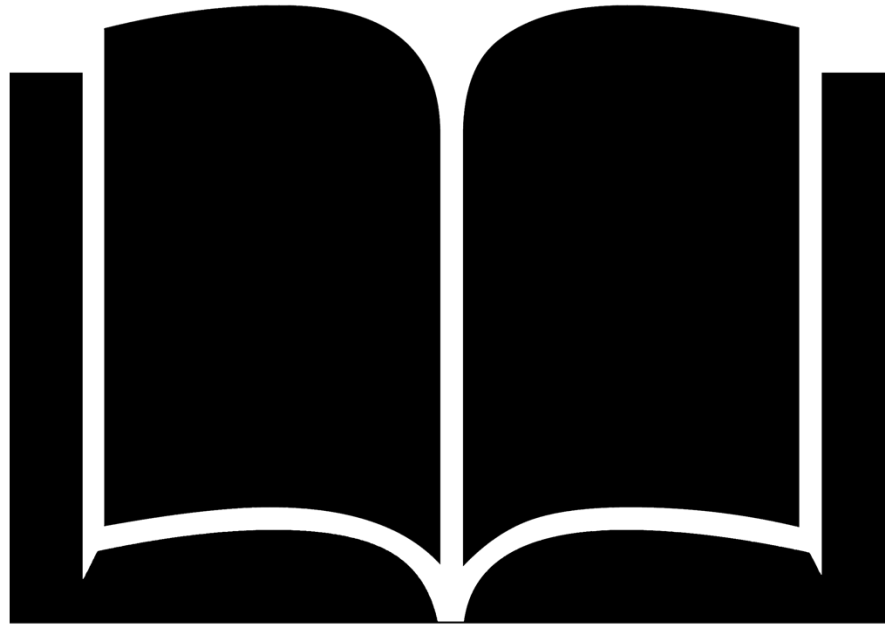



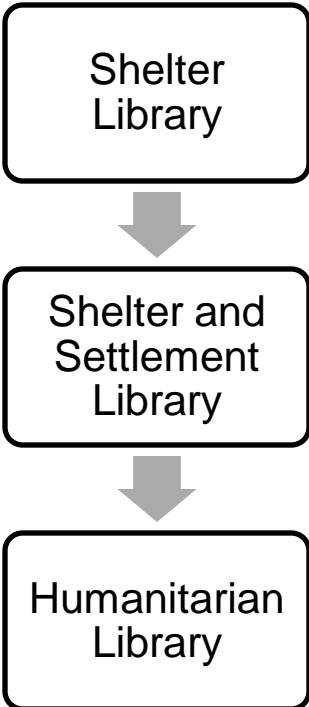

Humanitarian Training

- **Objective:** a common learning platform
- Includes all different types of training
- To support people's development
- Within the Humanitarian Training exists CORE Training



Summary: basic sustainable and scalable humanitarian technical training, delivered nationally in national languages, released open source. Messages are agreed globally through IASC clusters and through Regional Advisory Groups (RAGs). Cluster trainings and other trainings support only a small percentage of humanitarian capacity worldwide, often emphasising international over national stakeholders.

Future: ECHO is continuing funding for 2013 via the CCCM Cluster as 'CCCM-CORE'. IOM is the key partner, supporting a probable roll-out involving 11 trainings, expanding from the 3 funded through ECHO. A broad RAG was led previously with HFHI and now also with IOM, involving RedR India and Humanitarian Benchmark as CORE master trainers.
