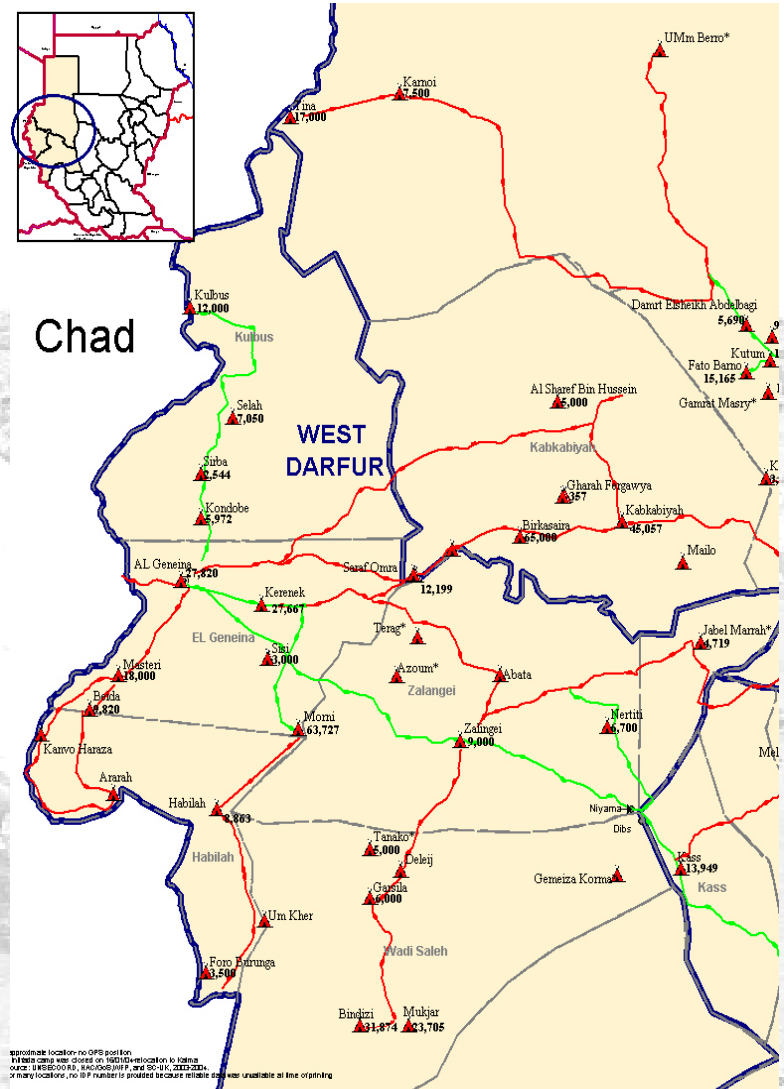

The crisis in Darfur...

- ❖ 2 million conflict-affected persons requiring assistance
- ❖ 200,000 refugees in Chad
- ❖ 1.6 million IDPs
- ❖ 10,000 deaths per month
- ❖ 6,000 national & int'l aid workers
- ❖ \$190 million still needed by end of 2004



What has been done...

- ❖ 70% of conflicted-affected population provided with food
- ❖ 52% received shelter and other critical survival items
- ❖ 40% have access to clean water
- ❖ 67% covered by primary health care facilities



What has been done...

Al Jeneina – West Darfur

- ❖ 218,000 IDPs being housed in and around the town
- ❖ 80,000 IDPs in planned temporary settlements
- ❖ 12,000 IDPs in school compounds etc.



What has been done...

❖ 126,000 IDPs being hosted by families within the town and surrounding area



❖ 1 million IDPs in rural areas plus initial returnees from Chad – limited resources inhibits hosting



What more needs to be done...

❖ Provision of durable, flexible shelter assistance



❖ Relocation considering protection, livelihoods and environmental issues



What more needs to be done...

❖ Support for longer-term hosting incl. facilities and infrastructure upgrading



❖ Creative settlement assistance in rural areas
